REMINISCENCIA

What will happen to the traces we leave when we are no longer here?

Through a gentle use of digital technologies, Malicho digs deep into his biography and the recent history of his city, Santiago, Chile - as well as its painful scars. With a narrative built through Google Earth, photographs, and videos published on different sites, this experience focuses on magical and unique places that reveal an emotional topography; conveying a relationship with a city that is different for everyone, but one in which we inevitably find each other.

From the alleyway where his family home is nestled, he travels back in time to long gone eras and to love stories that never die. *Reminiscencia* is a personal story, as much as it is a reflection on Chile half a century after the coup détat. The city and the streets of Santiago become witnesses, providing evidence of a complex history, past and present.

Malicho Vaca Valenzuela walks on stage and sits behind a computer, facing the audience. Behind him is a giant screen showing the progression of the stories and images he collects and brings together. His voice remains calm and steady. There is nothing that could offend anyone, no violence.

At first glance, *Reminiscencia* appears to be a personal story. Slowly it becomes a detailed investigation of the past of a country and of its collective memory.

Reminiscencia traces the personal history of a family through the evolution of a city, leading us through a series of small stories and questions that turn out to become larger and more important than ever imagined. The revelation of an ugly past serves to help us create a better future by not repeating the mistakes of the past.

This piece emerged during the Pandemic. Malicho wanted to create a theatre that responded to the times. He didn't want to simply recreate live theatre as an online experience. He felt the need to create theatre from a place of intimacy, of closeness; a Revolution of Tenderness, as he calls it.

During the lockdowns, the only way we could connect with each other was through the cold screen of a computer. With his digital version of *Reminiscencia*, he wanted to envision the experience as a sort of an online bonfire where people could huddle around and listen to a story.

In the piece Malicho asks: What will happen to the traces we leave when we are no longer here? Will the voices we use on the streets be stored on an external drive? What stories will Google tell about us when we are no longer here? Will we be able to find each other, touch, and conjure together the reality we desire?
